### **4. Monitored Withdrawal – deadline Mar 16**

"You may withdraw from a course by completing a Monitored Withdrawal Request form in the office of the school offering the course. The form for withdrawing from a Dietrich School course is available in the Office of Student Records in 140 Thackeray Hall. Students must process the Monitored Withdrawal Request form by the deadline. A W grade will be assigned for the course. A W grade does not impact a student's GPA.

Withdrawing from a course does not adjust a student's tuition or fee obligations. However, withdrawing from a course may jeopardize satisfactory academic progress, financial aid, and athletic eligibility."

### **STUDY TIPS: Try new strategies!**

Try mind-mapping information. Skim through your notes and write down the big ideas (things that might be headings or sub-headings) and major vocabulary words. Then, on a blank sheet of paper, recall as much information as you can about those big ideas and concepts without looking at your notes.

Try to make connections throughout the unit, and to previous units if you can. This will solidify what you know, while simultaneously diagnosing your weak spots in the curriculum.

Don't study in large groups. Ideally, make study groups that are 3-4 people max so that you are able to discuss material but do not get too distracted and off topic.

Be flexible in your study methods-- what works for one class may not necessarily work for another.

The positions will involve conducting field surveys and/or assisting with animal husbandry. Applicants must be available to work from May-August 2018, and the positions may be extended. Oakland Campus Job Description:

- Animal research assistant at the University of Pittsburgh: The primary focus of this position will be to care for and ensure the health of captive amphibians at the University of Pittsburgh's Oakland campus in Pittsburgh, PA. Responsibilities include maintaining captive colonies of amphibians and taking regular measurements and developmental data, with the opportunity to participate in research projects taking place in the lab. This position is paid hourly.

PLE Job Description:

- Field and mesocosm and animal husbandry assistant in Linesville, PA: 3 assistants will help with both field surveys of amphibians and maintenance of amphibians colonies in Linesville, PA at the University of Pittsburgh's field station, the Pymatuning Laboratory of Ecology. The animal husbandry will involve maintaining and monitoring a large-scale mesocosm experiment, including taking measurements, checking water levels/quality, and transporting metamorphosing animals, as well as maintaining animals in a field laboratory. The field research will involve amphibian surveys both at night and during the day at multiple sites per month. Previous experience in husbandry and field research is desirable. The fellowship awards a stipend of \$1000; in addition, it requires students to register for 1 credit of research. Please note that if the 1 credit pushes a fellowship winner over 18 credits, with special permission the Fellow may register for this credit in a later term.
